NEW CHRISTIAN SCIENCE MONITOR INTRODUCED

The 100 year old International daily Christian Science Monitor newspaper is now available in three new state of the art formats. It still contains features which objectively discuss current national and international events.

First, the Print Monitor is now published weekly with many more news filled pages. It features in-depth, insightful articles on the issues of the day and of universal interest.

Secondly, a Daily News Briefing is published daily, Monday through Friday on the internet. The editors select and address the most important issues of the day. Usually three pages in length, it is available by subscription.

In addition, the Monitor can be read on line at website, CSMonitor.com. In this format, it is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and updated daily.

Copies of the Monitor are available at the Christian Science Reading Room, corner of 5th and Main in Hendersonville. The public is welcome to stop by to read, buy, enter subscriptions or pick up samples. The Reading Room is open Monday, Friday and Saturday from 10 to 2 and Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 10 until 4. The Reading Room is closed on Sunday. Phone is 693-5150.

The Reading Room window now features the new Monitor in its three formats. Inside is a computer for viewing and reading the Monitor on line.

The Monitor was founded by Mary Baker Eddy to offset the “yellow” and sensational journalism of the period. The objective of the Monitor is to “injure no man, but bless all mankind.” It has won 7 Pulitzer prizes and maintains its own network of foreign and national correspondents.
